# WHAT IS CONSIDERED HOMELESS?

## LITERALLY HOMELESS

Individual or family who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.

## IMMINENT RISK OF HOMELESSNESS

Individual or family who will lose their primary nighttime residence within 14 days.

In addition to rental assistance, the BCFES Housing First Project can provide furniture, supportive resources, life skills courses, and access to community partners to support housing and educational stability.

A Housing Coach and Peer Advocate will support youth with housing searches, obtaining employment, and pursuing postsecondary education.
